The goal of this program is to partner with teens from schools across our state to raise awareness of teen driving safety and to reduce teen driving injuries and deaths. - We encourage you to utilize various forms of media to spread the word about your Champion Schools Project. A *sample* press release is included online at *UGotBrains.com* under the Media & Promotion section on the Tools for School page.
- Don't forget to use websites and social media to increase the profile of your project and as a way to measure impact of your project. Please post a picture and an article about your school's selection as a Champion School and link <u>UGotBrains.com</u> on your school and community websites.
- Social media is essential to promoting your campaign and raising awareness about teen safe driving. Please encourage ALL students who participate in the campaign to like/follow us on Facebook, Instagram and Twitter @JerseyDrives. We will be posting helpful tips throughout the course of the program.
- Research shows that **parental involvement** is key to new drivers' safety on the road. Teens who say their parents set rules and monitor their driving in a helpful and supportive way are half as likely to be in a crash.
